


Field Force Training:

The Steps









Basic Requirements

Legal Requirements:

- ☐ Be at least 17 but not older than 22 the day you report to West Point
- ☐ Be a United States Citizen
- ☐ Not be married
- ☐ Not be pregnant or legally responsible for any children



Basic Requirements (con't)


- □ Leadership
 - Demonstrated leadership in school, community, church, scouts, etc.
- ☐ Academic Qualifications:
 - Above average High School or College academic record
 - Strong performance on ACT/SAT (with Writing portion)
- ☐ Medical Qualifications:
 - Good physical and mental health
 - Pass a Qualifying Medical Exam
- ☐ Physical Qualifications:
 - Above average strength, endurance, and agility
 - Good performance on Candidate Fitness Assessment (CFA)

Academic Preparation

Recommended

English	4 Years
Mathematics (including Trigonometry and Pre-Calculus)	4 Years
Laboratory Science (Physics or Chemistry)	2 Years
Foreign Language	2 Years
United States History	1 Year
Computer Technology	1 Year









Apply for a Nomination

Congressional Nomination:

Determined by nominating source

Service-Connected Nomination:

RC will determine applicants eligibility



Apply for a Nomination

Congressional

- ◆ Each Member of Congress is authorized five (5) Cadet Appointments at West Point at any one time.
- ◆ Each Member may nominate up to ten (10) young people to fill each vacancy.
- ◆ The Vice President has five (5) Cadet Appointments for applicants from the United States at large.

Contact Congressional offices EARLY; each member has his/her own time schedule & process

Nominations are due to West Point **no later than 31 January** for **ALL** nominations




Apply for a Nomination

Service-Connected	
◆ Presidential: Sons & Daughters of career military personnel	100
◆ Regular Army & Reserve Components	85, 85
◆ ROTC & JROTC Schools	20
◆ Sons & Daughters of deceased & 100% disabled veterans	~15
◆ Sons & Daughters of Medal of Honor awardees	Unlimited

Nominations are due to West Point **no later than 31 January** for **ALL** nominations








Complete USMA Forms

- ☐ Candidate Personal Data Record
- ☐ Request for Academic Information
- ☐ School Official Evaluations
 - **□** Math
 - ☐ English

 - ☐ Physical Education
- ☐ Candidate Activities Record
- ☐ Essay / Candidate Statement
- ☐ Candidate Fitness Assessment








Obtain a Nomination

- Nominations are due to West Point no later than 31 January
- Congressional offices set their own deadlines for applications
- A Nomination is NOT an Appointment
- Advice for Candidates:
 - Make the best impression possible; be prepared for your interview
 - Be aggressive in pursuing nominations!








Complete Testing

- ☐ The EARLIER the BETTER
- □ ACT/SAT
 - West Point takes the highest component scores from either test
 - Last test dates to have scores arrive in time for consideration
 - SAT = January
 - ACT = February
 - These should not be the first time taking the test
- Qualifying Medical Exam
 - administered through DODMERB
- □ Candidate Fitness Assessment (CFA)







Await Evaluation

 Files must be complete by the end of February or beginning of March depending on the calendar year.


- West Point uses a deadline admissions process (Deadline 28 FEB); the earlier your file is complete, the earlier you will be considered for qualification and selection
- The majority of offers are made in Feb-April



Await Evaluation

- Early File Completion allows:
 - More time for the Candidate to improve based on Field Force and RC recommendations
 - Earlier consideration for a Medical Waiver if needed
 - Earlier qualification that the Candidate can take into a nominating interview
 - Greater chance to be authorized an overnight visit in the Fall/Spring (with LOA or LOE)








Visit West Point

- Candidate Orientation Visits
 - Available Monday through Friday during the academic year
 - Daily Visits: for students who are at least in their sophomore year of high school
 - Overnight Visits: for those who are competitive for an offer of admission (LOA, LOE, or Offered) **No overnight visits on a Friday**
- Visits are cadet-escorted and offer a real "inside look" at the Academy

Admissions Strategy

- Be proactive and aggressive through process
- Communicate with local Field Force Representative
- Candidate's email / phone number on file (Not Parents)
- Emails / Calls from Candidates (Not Parents)
- Apply to all available nomination sources EARLY
- Complete Application EARLY
- Schedule Medical Exam EARLY
- Take ACT/SAT multiple times (Request ACT Writing)
- Train for the Candidate Fitness Assessment (CFA)
- Consider ROTC in addition to West Point
- Make the Admissions Decision that is Right for YOU!
